

Covid-19 Troop 76 Guidelines for Camping and Service

Camping Guidelines:

- Tenting - single scout in tent or cabin tents (i.e. separate partitioned sleeping quarters within tents; 1 scout per partition)
- Hygiene - hand washing station; used frequently, hand sanitizers, gloves (when needed), masks will be mandatory when minimum 6' social distancing is not possible.
- Bathroom - utilize the woods :)
- Drop off/pick up - parents drive their own scouts, permission slips are all done electronically (no paper slips), no car pooling, parents will need to answer a few questions (see page 2 for sample) before scouts can exit the car.
- Temperature checks - check participant's (scout and adult) temperature upon arrival, parent needs to wait while temp is verified, temps checked periodically during event
- Location - campout will stay within Ridgefield. Backyards, Sturges Park when opened
- Games - socially distanced games, must wear masks/gloves if playing something like cards
- Fire pits - multiple fire pits to keep social distancing
- Meals - only use of disposable plates/utensils.
- Limit number of participants to adhere to state guidelines (as of 6/7/20 - 25 total people at outdoor an event). Of those participating, there must be at least 4 adults per troop guidelines.

Service Guidelines:

- Outdoor service only
- Mask and gloves
- Must be able to maintain social distancing
- Limit participants (10 total including adults and based on available space to allow 6' social distancing requirement)
- Keep record of participants who have attended, including adults
- Temperature check when arriving, parent needs to wait before leaving to confirm temp check, parents also need to answer a few questions before scout can exit car (see page 2 for sample questions)
- Only parent of scout can drop off or pick up, no car pooling

Sample Questions to Be Asked About Scouts:

- Does your scout have a fever or felt feverish in the past 14-21 days?
- Does your scout have any trouble breathing or experiencing shortness of breath?
- Does your scout have a cough?
- Has your scout or anyone in your family been in contact with someone who has tested positive for Covid-19 in the past 14 days?
- Has your scout or immediate family members traveled in the past 14 days to a region still considered a high risk area for Covid-19?
- *Please note that a positive answer (yes) to these questions will result in the scout being asked to not participate in person in the activity. For a campout, the troop will be happy to have the scout participate virtually.*
